#### BE THE CHANGE COMMITTEE

The Be the Change Committee would like to recognize April 28<sup>th</sup> as the National Day of Mourning for those who have died or who are injured on the job. On average, three to four Canadian workers are killed every day on the job; every year, young workers are seriously injured or killed at their job site. Young males aged 15 to 24 are twice as likely to get injured on the job. Hospitality, construction, and retail are the top three industries for injuries to young workers.

All workers have the right to know about potential hazards in the workplace; the right to participate in identifying and resolving workplace health and safety concerns; the right to refuse unsafe work; and the right to exercise these rights without being punished or fired.

This unique outdoor course will take place at both the Sardis Secondary School Greenhouse and the new Sardis Secondary School Farm (on Richardson Avenue). Students will be taught about food production through practical hands-on experiences. Students will learn skills in land preparation, planting, weed control, pest management, fertilizing, pruning, harvesting, marketing and sales. They will also work alongside community partners who are specialists in the various commodities grown. As a side benefit, students will

be consumers of the various foods grown and will be encouraged to prepare the food and eat it with their families.
