Frequently Asked Questions – Group 1 and 2 Financial Awards

1. In the SD33 application form, what should I put under the column, "nature of involvement", in the activities resume section?

The fields in this section are expandable to allow you to add a few sentences highlighting things you have done in that role. How much information you include is up to you, but our donors typically appreciate a bit more information! In other words....you could simply enter 'volunteer coach' or you could provide more detail by entering 'Assisted the head coach with training and conditioning athletes, building game rosters and managing players on the field'.

2. With group 2 scholarships, if it is not specified in the scholarship description, do I still attach a transcript and reference letters with my application for that scholarship?

Yes, all of your group 2 applications will include:

- SD33 Application (including career statement, scholarship essay and budget).
- Student Reference Letters 3 maximum, 2 minimum
- Transcript BLACK OUT YOUR PEN NUMBER FOR CONFIDENTIALITY.
- PLUS Additional attachments such as essays, only if requested on the application.
- 3. If a requirement for a specific scholarship requires a career statement and career goal, do I still attach a separate document to my application? (The original SD33 application already requires a career statement, and the career goal must be stated on the application form).

If a scholarship requests this in a different format, such as a cover letter, please include it again.

4. If a scholarship requires a copy of my current transcript, can I use an unofficial copy from studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca?

An unofficial transcript printed from the student transcript service is all that you need for Group 1 and 2 Financial Awards.

5. Every scholarship requires proof of enrollment at a recognizable university. How do I show proof of enrollment?

Proof of enrollment is only required in order for the winner to claim the award, not at the time of application. By the time you are claiming an award, you will be enrolled in university.
